

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# Sunday, June 2nd Welcome to New York!



Your journey north begins at the architectural gem, Grand Central Station. We will have an art tour ambassador meet you there to accompany you for the ride to Beacon. This 90-minute scenic ride travels along the beautiful Hudson River. We will pick you up at the Beacon train station, only a few minutes from our centrally located lodging. The Roundhouse is a family-owned property, steeped in New York history and situated on the Fishkill Creek and Falls. Once used to manufacture dye, the original brick and beams have been carefully integrated into the re-imagining of the buildings as a restaurant and hotel. Each room is unique and has local artisan touches. We will rendezvous for an aperitif and do a little paint sketching overlooking the falls before having dinner (included) at the Roundhouse restaurant.














# Monday, June 3rd Double Header Art Day Dia Beacon / Storm King

Enjoy the daily deluxe continental breakfast that includes a bag of fresh baked pastries and bagels delivered to your door. Ten minutes away is the incomparable Dia Beacon. We will spend the morning strolling through this contemporary art venue in the historic Nabisco box warehouse. Room after room of some of the most iconic artists of the 21st century, lit by natural light will leave us inspired, fulfilled and ready for lunch. We will dine at Dia's quick and easy restaurant (included) before heading back for a little repose.

If you are wanting an afternoon pick me up there is an artisan coffee house just across the bridge. Our second outing takes us to the astonishing Storm King, where sculpture is seen in situe in this 500 acre park. We will tour the landscape taking the hop on/ hop off shuttle that traverses through and around the sculpture beautifully placed in nature.

The evening is yours for dinner in town or staying close to home.



# **Tuesday, June 4th** Make Art and Meet Artists

We will start the morning with a little sketching at Beacon's Long Dock Park on the banks of the Hudson. The afternoon is yours to explore the town of Beacon and the myriad of artisanal shops right outside your door.

The Hudson Valley is home to some stellar artists, and I have invited a few of them to take a break from their busy schedules and join us for apero and snacks (included). A local sommelier will be on hand to share a few special local wines.



# Wednesday, June 5th


#### Thomas Cole House and Lunch in Hudson

We will head out to find our roots with the Hudson River School. Our destination is the home/studio and now museum of painter and environmentalist Thomas Cole. After touring this historic property, we will lunch in nearby Hudson at one of its charming restaurants.


Chill out and savor your last afternoon at the Roundhouse before we walk into town for dinner in town at an old school Italian restaurant (included).







Henry Hudson first sailed up the river 400 years ago and brought with him an era of industrialization. New communities sprung up to sustain brickyards, dye plants and other manufacturing that shipped their goods down river to literally build New York City. Social and political dignitaries such as FDR & Vanderbuilt found refuge here and renowned educational programs at The Culinary Institute of America, Vasser and Bard continue to thrive. The landscape is still rural and home to split-railed horse farms, but stellar restaurants and craft libations are easily found in the small towns the populate the terrain.



# Thursday, June 6th Saying Adieu and Train to NYC

I suggest you book your flight home to stay an extra night in NYC. We will shuttle you to the Beacon train station for you to venture on to NYC or beyond. Savor the beauty of Grand Central station before you tap into the pulse of the city that never sleeps.





# Meet Your Tour Insider Nancy Willis

Artist Nancy Willis lives and works in the Napa Valley, an area known for its food, wine and natural beauty. As a painter and printmaker, Willis pulls from the rituals of her daily life to explore themes of intimacy and human connection. String lights in trees, dinner table scenes and local terrain become motifs in her paintings and prints that evoke a sense of place.


Her work has been featured at the Start Up Fairs in Houston, LA and San Francisco and in exhibitions in Brooklyn, Albuquerque and Cincinnati. Years of supporting her studio with work in the hospitality industry led to a nine-year teaching assignment at the Culinary Institute of America. Willis currently teaches painting and printmaking at the Napa Valley College and Nimbus Arts. She successfully launched Path of an Artist painting tours to France in 2007 and expanded the workshops to Sundance in 2009 and Hudson Valley in 2024.
